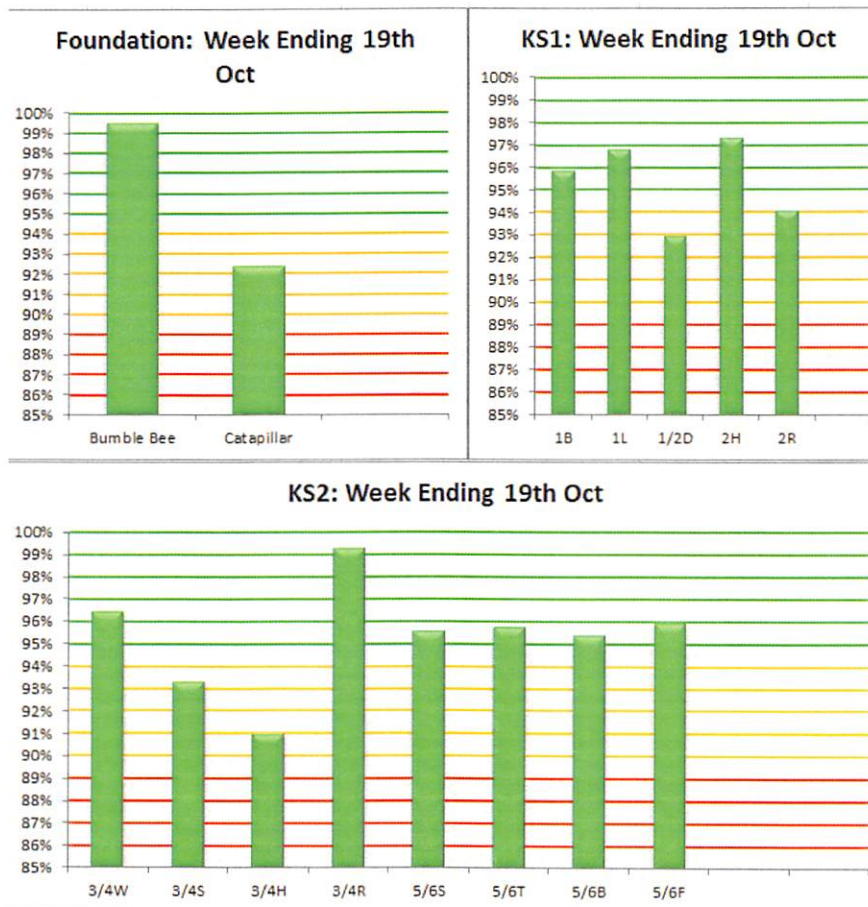


**WHOLE SCHOOL ATTENDANCE
