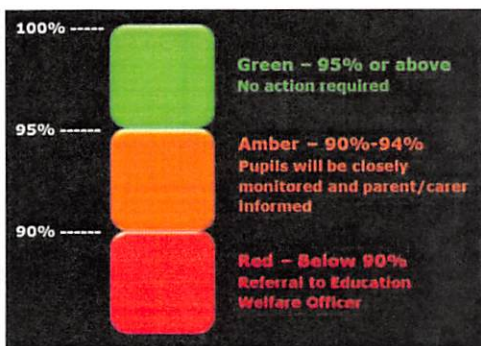

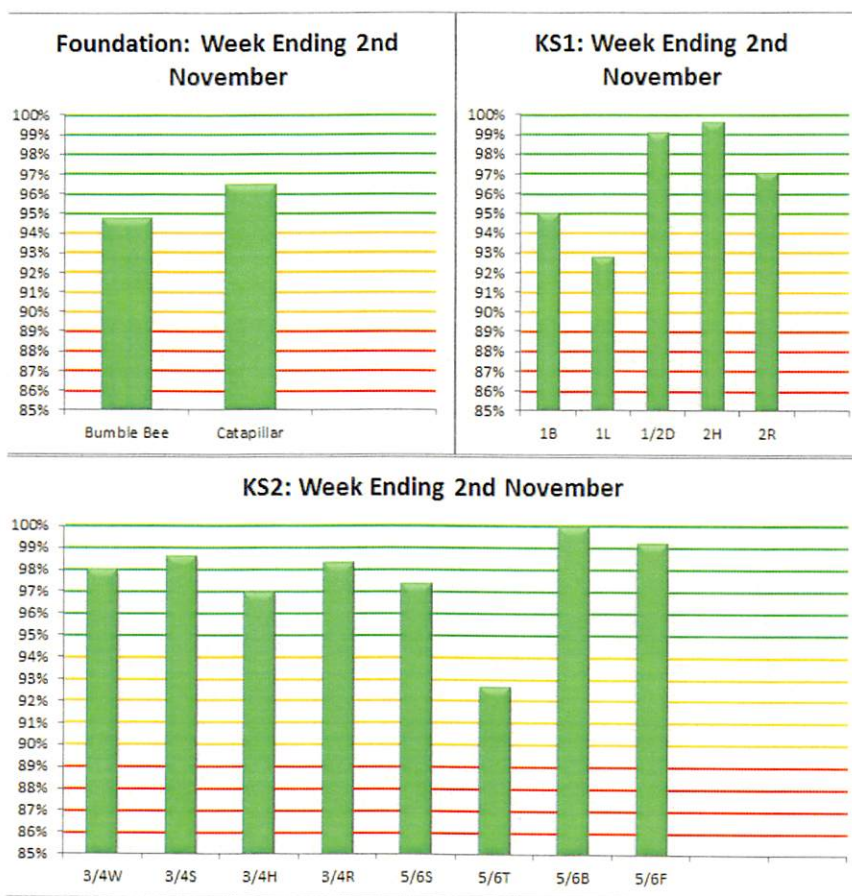


WHOLE SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

Key stage 1 News

Wow, a fabulous start to the week following on from the alien spaceship crash landing. On Monday all KS1 children experienced the breath-taking world of astronomy via a planetarium workshop. This awe inspiring branch of science has triggered a variety of different learning experiences this week. The children discovered the planets and their place, size, similarities and differences within the solar system. They found out about the first landing on the moon and how astronauts use the space station and Tim Peake's first visit into space. Together the class star gazed, observed and experienced the different constellations and their significance in relation to each other. In maths children have been developing their numeracy skills and understanding of money. Whilst in English they have been learning about the difference between fact and opinion and how we can use why, what, where, when and who in our writing ready for our investigative news reports linking to the alien crash landing at WWA.

Foundation Stage News

This week we started our new topic- what happens when I fall asleep? We found out about who works at night and had some interesting discussions about jobs and what people do at work. Parents could help with our learning by pointing out the moon and stars, perhaps you could spot an animal who likes to be out at night too? Next week we will be building some rockets so we can explore outer space. Our maths work is based on more, fewer, bigger, smaller amounts; this is something children could practise at home. Finally thank you to all our parents and carers who supported our Parents' Evenings, we were very proud to show you how far the children have come in such a short time.

Year 3 & 4 News

Our second week back at Wybers Wood has been 100mph! It was great to get a chance to meet all of our children's parents in Year 3 and 4. It was a pleasure to talk to you and feedback all of the fantastic things your children have already achieved this academic year. In Topic and Science, we have been looking at the power of forces, which act on an object. We made paper windmills and tested the force of a magnet when it is presented with different objects.

In Literacy we have been taking a deeper insight into an explanation text which told us how to play Temple Run! Once the children had learnt the basics, they challenged each other to see who could get the most points! Sadly, most of the teachers came last!

Year 5 & 6 News

This week, we have been continuing our descriptive writing in English. Year 5 have been writing a short descriptive piece about a hurricane whilst Year 6 have been writing about the aftermath of an earthquake using the five senses and a variety of descriptive devices such as: personification, metaphors and similes. The school athletics' team has also been successful this week as they finished second behind a very strong Healing team in the indoor athletics.
