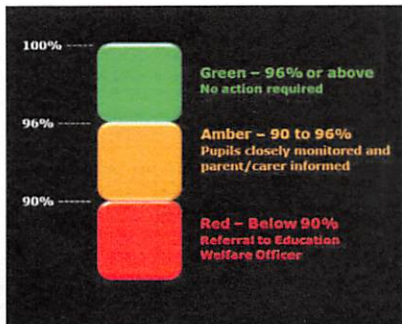

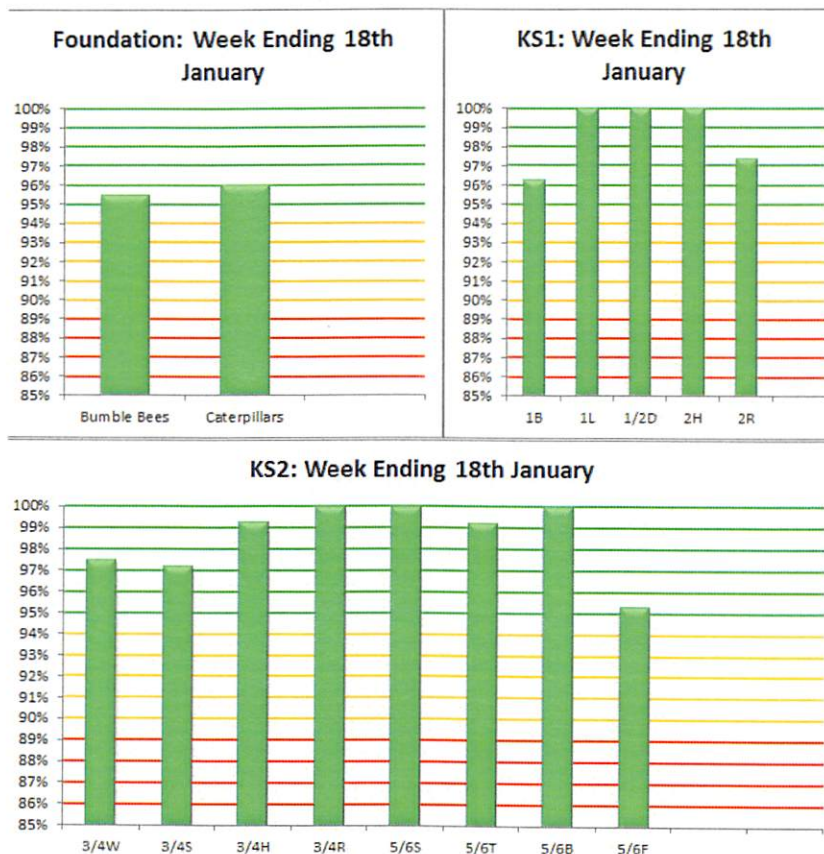


**WHOLE SCHOOL ATTENDANCE
