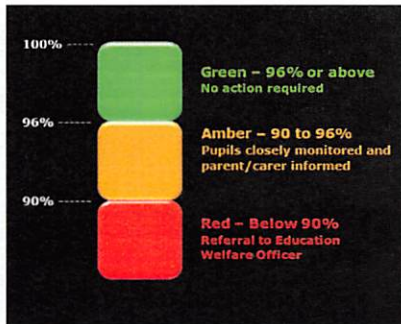

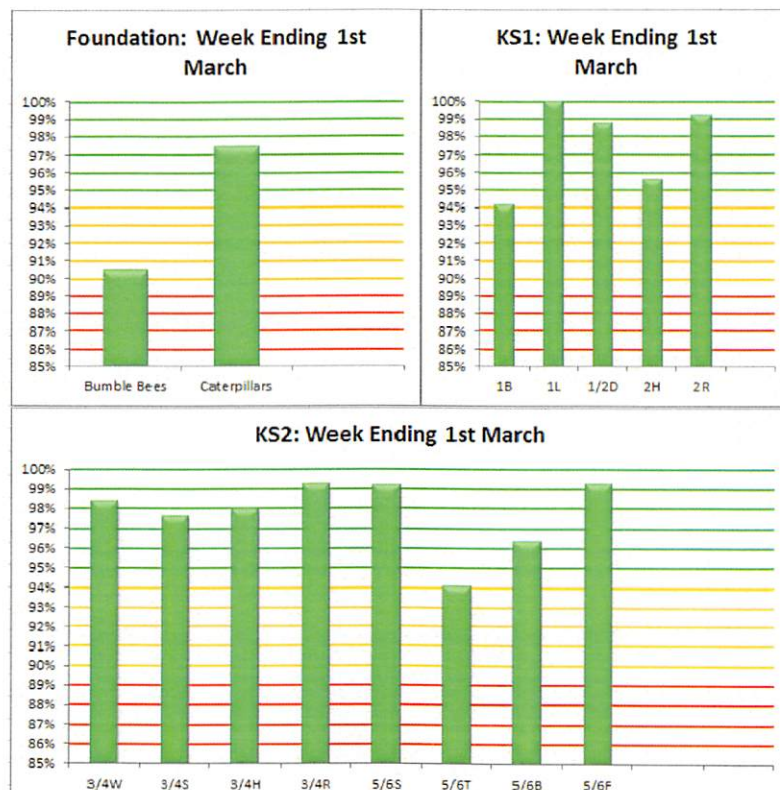
WHOLE SCHOOL ATTENDANCE
