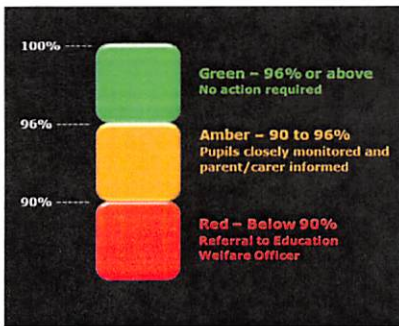

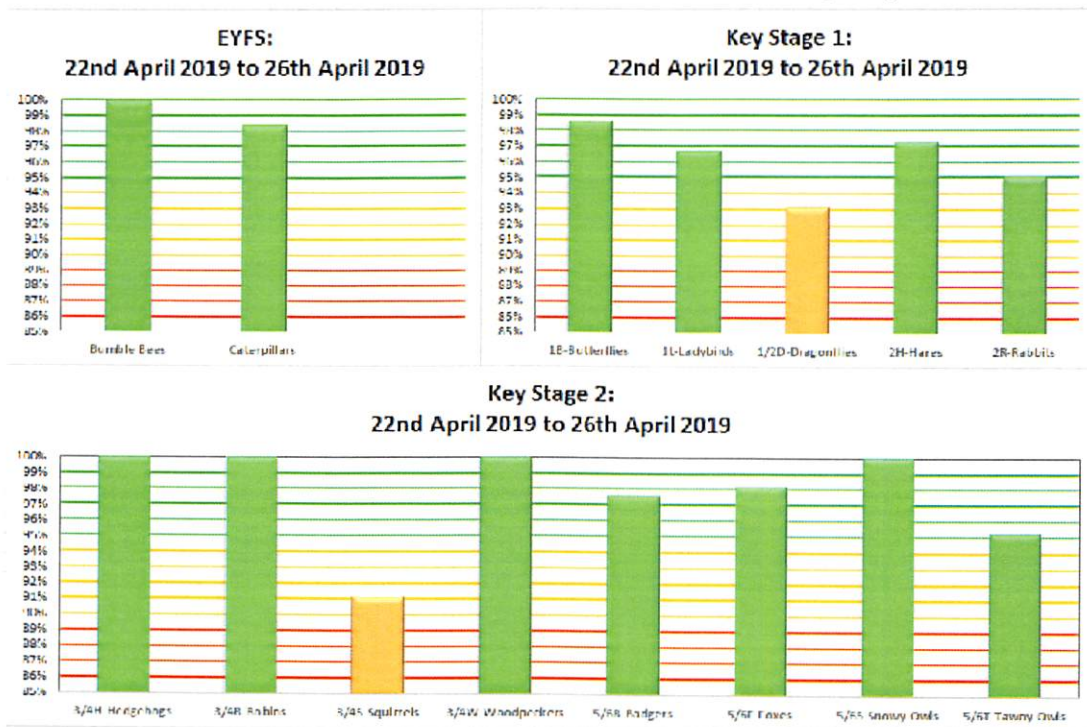


**WHOLE SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

Named Clothing

To avoid arguments after PE or in classrooms when jumpers are removed, please ensure children's clothing is clearly named.

Threadworm Infection: This is a common infection & we have been informed that this may currently be a problem with some children who attend our school. The main symptom of the infection is a tickling or itching of the anal area at night. Sleep may be disturbed and some children develop sore bottoms. Others are sometimes constantly hungry and may develop mood swings. Some children show no symptoms though & worms can only be seen in the toilet. Please seek medical support if you suspect your child may be infected. Strict hygiene measures are needed to prevent re-infections and we are reinforcing the need for scrupulous handwashing in school.
