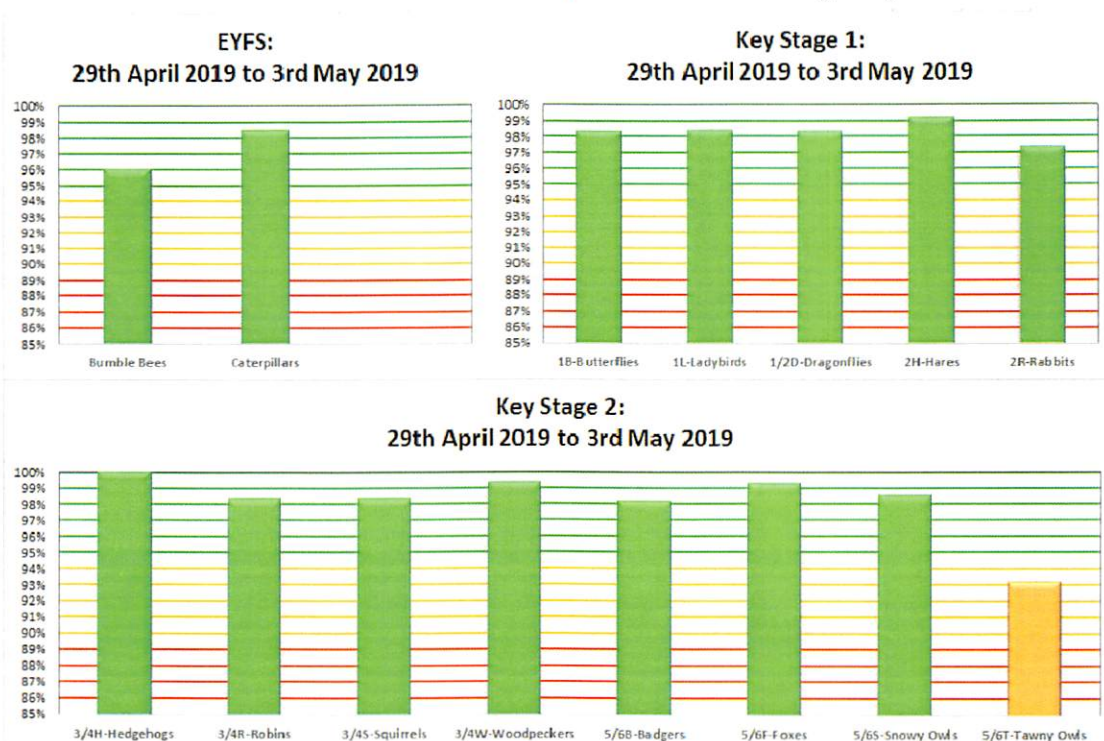


**WHOLE SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

### **General Messages:**

#### **Y6 SATS Week**

Next week is an important one for our Y6 pupils as they are sitting their statutory assessment tests. If for any reason a Y6 child is unwell, please could parent/carers let us know as early as possible in the morning; the office is staffed from 8am. We are very proud of all the children's attitudes in the run up to the tests and we trust they also feel a strong sense of pride in the progress they are making.

**Risk Assessments if your child is injured:** If your child has any injury or a condition preventing them from going out on to the playground or taking part in PE, please could parent/carers ensure they speak to a member of the admin team. We can then complete a risk assessment for the child to prevent further problems occurring if they do an activity causing additional harm.

### Key Stage 1 News

Our Superhero topic has been continuing nicely this week, with our superhero portraits and a look at heroic figures from the past. Last week we had an exciting visit from PC Mike, and now we are investigating what he does to help us, and what his job is like.

We have been discussing what to do if we needed help, and how to contact the emergency services if necessary. If your child doesn't know their address, could you practice this with them please, to ensure that they know where they live if they ever did require help.

### Foundation Stage News

After our wonderful (but wet) farm visit last week we have been focusing on remembering our favourite parts of the visit and writing our memories down. This has produced some lovely work, the children are really trying to use all the sounds they know to create words.

Our chicks arrived back after the long weekend twice as big and very noisy, they have been entertaining us all week, the children have really enjoyed caring for them and taking turns to hold one.

In maths we are focusing on our number bonds, knowing that  $3+4$  gives the same answer as  $4+3$  and that  $7-4=$  means that  $7-3=4$ . This is a tricky concept but we have been using counters to help us visualise it.

### Year 3 & 4 News

What a busy week it has been in Year 3 and 4! We have made chocolate lollies and written instructions in our literacy lessons on how you can make your own. We made sure to include imperative verbs and adverbs to ensure they are clear and easy to follow. We are sure this recipe will be popular!
