

### **Wybers Wood Academy Behaviour Policy COVID-19 Update – 27.05.2020**

When we return to school, children will need to behave very differently. Due to social distancing measures, some new expectations will need to be followed by all pupils and staff who are attending Wybers Wood Academy during this pandemic.

There will be new systems in place and children will need to follow these. These changes are listed below and will be communicated to pupils, parents, staff and AAB members. All other aspects of the behaviour policy remain the same and our key focus is on positivity and building relationships.

All pupils in school will:

- Follow any altered routines for arrival and departure so that social distancing can be adhered to.
- Wash hands at regular intervals throughout the day and upon the instruction of the adult in their bubble.
- Catch it, kill it, bin it needs to be strictly adhered to and followed up with the necessary hand hygiene.
- Tell an adult if they are experiencing any of the symptoms of the coronavirus. These symptoms include: a recent high temperature, persistent cough or loss of smell or taste.
- Follow any direction given from the adults in their 'bubble' to limit contact throughout the school. Pupils will be taught how to move around the site safely maintaining good social distance.
- Use only the equipment that has been put out for them. If any extra equipment is required, this will be wiped down after use.
- Listen carefully to the instructions regarding social distancing at playtime and use only the designated areas.
- Understand that severe behaviour involving spitting or coughing at or towards any other person, physical contact or consistently not following the social distancing rules may result in them not being allowed to attend the academy until such time as they can abide by the guidance or when social distancing rules are relaxed. A risk assessment will be carried out for those children who choose not to or are unable to follow social distancing procedures.

All pupils conducting their learning from home will:

- Follow safer internet rules
- Complete work following a timetable that is right for their family – do what you can, when you can.
- Tell a trusted adult or school contact if they have any worries.
- Regularly wash their hands.
- Liaise with their teacher via the online platforms if they can.
- Try to read everyday
